**Action**: Publicize the National Sea Scout Flagship competition and distribute the attached Sea Scout National Flagship Scoresheet immediately to all ships in your council.

In honor of the 90th anniversary of Sea Scouts in 2002, BoatUS, the nation's largest recreational boating organization, instituted the annual Sea Scout National Flagship Award. Since then the award has been presented to ships from Texas, Ohio, Maryland, West Virginia, California, and Oregon.

Now is the time for all ships to take stock of their past year's program and document their accomplishments to apply for the annual National Flagship Competition. You will find attached the Annual Sea Scout Flagship Application, Sea Scout Ship Performance outline and the Ship's Performance Scoresheet for the Journey to Excellence Award.

Make sure the ship meets the entire minimal standard on this scoresheet. If you feel that the ship qualifies, have the Sea Scouts in the ship put together a compelling packet of information that tells the judges why the ship deserves this prestigious honor. The application should include the completed scoresheet and a written narrative supplemented by other materials to support the ship's application. Supporting material can include, but is not limited to, videos, scrapbooks, newspaper clippings, meeting minutes, letters, etc. Be comprehensive, yet concise and creative.

A ship must meet the minimal national standards in all areas for a calendar year starting January 1 and ending December 31. The application is due to the National Sea Scout Office by March 31, 2013 to be considered for the National Flagship Award. Please note that simply filling out the scoresheet and mailing it without supporting materials will not qualify the ship for this award.

The ship that is awarded the National Flagship honor will be allowed to wear the National Flagship patch with the current year and fly the National Flagship flag with four stars. (There are patches for the uniform and a ship's flag available through the BSA Supply Group, which can be ordered and paid for by the winning ship).

# Scouting's Journey to Excellence

2012 Ship Performance Recognition Program

Journey to Excellence, the new performance recognition program, changes the basic way we measure and recognize success in the Boy Scouts of America by moving away from measuring process and moving to measuring performance. Below provides specific information to help you understand the criteria and exactly what data will be used to determine the three levels of performance. In planning your strategy, use actual numbers from the previous year to guide your performance improvement goal planning. The ship youth leaders should take the lead in making this assessment. In each area, the ship may qualify by meeting a specific standard or by showing measured improvement.

1	The ship has regular activities (not including normal ship meetings).
2	At charter renewal time, have an increase in the number of youth members over the number of youth members on the previous year's charter renewal.
3	Number of youth members on this year's recharter (C) divided by the number of youth members on last year's recharter (D) plus any additional youth members (E) minus any transfer outs or age outs (F). Total = (C) / (D+E-F).
4	The ship has elected youth leaders as boatswain, boatswain's mate, yeoman, and purser who are leading the activities of the ship.
5	The ship participates in at least two service projects during the year and enters them on the Journey to Excellence website. The projects may be completed as joint projects with other organizations. At least one project must benefit the chartered organization.
6	Have a ship committee. All Skippers, mates, and members of commitee (paid or multiple registration) have completed <u>Sea Scout Adult Leader Basic</u> training, or new leaders complete them within three months of joining.
7	The ship participates in at least one super activity/long cruise of at least three days and nights, divided by the number of Sea Scouts on 6/30/2012.
8	Involve ship members' parents by having at least two parent meetings where ship activities and plans are reviewed and at least one parent from each family attends.
9	The ship has a written budget that is reviewed at all ship committee meetings, and the ship follows BSA policies relating to fundraising and fiscal management as found on the Unit Money-Earning Application form, the ships purser's book, and any other publication that the council has developed for fundraising and fiscal management.
10	The crew meetings have activities that include a physical fitness component. This is ongoing and members can track their performance.
11	Complete the ship's charter renewal paperwork, including all required signatures, and submit completed forms to the council service center before the end of the charter year.

Scoring the ship's performance: To determine the ship's performance level, you will use the above information to determine the points earned for each of the 11 individual criteria and then add those individual point scores to determine a composite score. Count only the highest point total achieved in any one requirement. Bronze level requires earning 9 of the 11 criteria plus 700 points, Silver level requires earning 9 of 11 criteria and 1,000 points, and Gold level requires earning 9 of 11 criteria and 1,600 points.
